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

- Chor For you, Lord, is my desire. My God, my hope is in thee.

 Let me not be confounded, so that all me foes may not triumph over me.
- Aria I am and shall stay content, though here in time I may be blustered by cross, storm, and other trials; death, hell, and what must be. Though mishap strike thy faithful liege, right is and shall be ever right.
- Chor Lead me in your Truth and teach me; for you are the God who saves me; daily I await thee.
- Trio Cedars must before the winds often much torment suffer, often they are laid low. Advice and deeds to God entrust, heed not what howls against you, for his word teaches something entirely different.
- Chor My eyes are looking to the Lord; for he shall pull my foot from the net.
- Chor My days of sorrow God ends in joy; Christians on the thorny paths are led by heaven's power and blessing. God will remain my faithful treasure, I will not heed mankind's spite; Christ, who stands at our side, helps me battle victoriously.
- Motet O Jesu Christ mein's Lebens Licht BWV 118

O Jesus Christ, the light of my life, my refuge, my consolation, my confidence, on earth I am only a guest and am very pressed by the load of my sins.

- Chor Wake up, the voice of the watchmen very high in the tower calls us, Wake up, thou city Jerusalem! Midnight is the hour; They call us with bright voices: Where are you clever virgins? Make haste, the bridegroom comes; Rise up, take your lamps! Alleluia! Prepare yourselves, to the wedding feast you must go to meet him!
- Recit. He comes, the bridegroom comes! You daughters of Zion come out. He is quickly exiting the heavens into your mother's house. The bridegroom comes, who is like a roebuck and a young stage which on the hills leaps; To you he brings the wedding meal. Rise up, be lively! Welcome the bridegroom! There, see, he comes to meet you.

We all follow to joy's hall and join in the evening meal.
- Recit. So come inside to me, you, my elected bride! I have myself to you eternally betrothed. You, I will upon my heart, upon my arm like a seal engrave, and to your troubled eye'bring pleasure. Forget, O spirit, now the fear, the pain which you have endured; Upon my left hand you shall rest, and my right shall caress you.

and I am yours,

Love shall nothing divide.

I want to pasture in heaven's roses.

You shall pasture in heaven's roses.

Where the fullness of pleasure, where joy will abound.

Chor - Gloria be sung to thee, with mortal and angelic tongues, with harps and cymbals. Of twelves pearls are made the portals; We are consorts to your city, the angels high around your throne. No eye has yet perceived, nor ear hath yet heard such joy. Thus we find joy, io, ever in dulci jubilo.
