a brief note about this evening's performance . . .

In composing the festival cantata Rejoice in the Lamb, Benjamin Britten set excerpts from an extended poem of the same name (Jubilate Agno) by the 18th-century poet Christopher Smart. Jubilate Agno was written during Smart's mental illness which accounts for much of the unusual and colorful language. Tonight's concert will reconstruct the story of Christmas using excerpts from Smart's poetry, and Britten's masterwork: Rejoice in the Lamb. - mtk

David Peckham

David Peckham is an organist of multiple musical talents. Since 1980, he has been touring as a theatre organist and has appeared on the theatre organ circuit in San Francisco, Columbus, Toronto, and Pittsburgh, receiving enthusiastic reviews. Mr. Peckham will be making his first appearance at a national convention of the American Theatre Organ Society next summer in Los Angeles.

In December 1994, Peckham performed the world's first complete transcription of Tchaikovsky's <u>Nutcracker</u> with the Delaware Dance Company. The record crowd of over 3500 people cheered Peckham and the Company with long ovations and an encore engagement is scheduled for December 8-10 1995.

The spring of 1994 saw the release of Peckham's first compact disc recording, Electro Pneumatic Action, an excerpt of which was featured on Pipe Dreams, Public Radio International's showcase of organs and organists from around the world. Critics have described his playing as "top-notch and highly recommended".

Peckham's classical training at the Eastman School of Music has allowed him to pursue more traditional organ avenues as well. He has been organist at the Horseheads First United Methodist Church since 1985, and has accompanied numerous choral and instrumental groups throughout the area; he also performs as a classical recitalist. This will be his third appearance with the Cantata Singers.

David Peckham has been associated with L.A. Peckham and Son Pipe Organ Service since 1983, specializing in high quality pipe organ restoration, rebuilding and maintenance. He has also been Resident Organist at Clemens Center since 1977.

Lorrene Adams

Lorrene Adams is active as a teacher conductor and performer in the Ithaca area. She was musical director for the "Cornell Savoyard's 1994 production of The Gondoliers and the Ithaca Opera's Production of Strauss' Die Fledermaus. She is the Director of Music at the First United Methodist Church in Horseheads, as well as Artistic Director for the Valley Chorus in Waverly.

Ms. Adams is the founder and Artistic Director for the 30-voice Opera Chorus Ensemble in Ithaca and the newly organized Elmira-Corning Community Children's Choir.

Prior to coming to Ithaca, Ms. Adams taught near Olean, New York. In addition to her academic appointments, she has served as Director of Music and organist at several churches and was director of several community choruses.
