Six months of freezing temperatures and icy roads create the climate of welcoming a mid-winter thaw. "Thaw" finds inspiration in the changing weather for creative processes and concepts. For this collaborative exhibition with the (Southern Tier) Festival of Women in the Arts (Southern Tier), and the Regional Gallery Director's Forum centered in Rochester, the concept for Thaw explores anything that melts, anything in flux or emerging because of the seasons. It searches glowing warmth It plumbs the depths of psychological or spiritual or physical change.

Our featured artist, Masha Ryskin, finds inspiration in landscape elements as metaphor for passage of time or memory. Through the deft use of her tools at hand she maintains complete control of her linear processes. In those processes, Ryskin uses a variety of media, including drawing and painting, printmaking, installation, and fibers.

Ryskin has exhibited nationally and internationally, participating in numerous artist residencies, both in the United States and abroad. She is a recipient of many grants and fellowships, including a Fulbright grant to Norway. Ryskin is a graduate of Rhode Island School of Design and the University of Michigan




