Festival that celebrates women, the arts just keeps growing

Susan Nagle, organizer of the Festival of Women and the Arts, says she is amazed at how the event has grown and grown.

"In our first year, we had 12 events," she said. "The next year, we had two dozen. This year, we will have over three dozen events associated with the festival."

What started as an outreach of the Cantata Singers, a choral group led by Will Wickham, now involves dozens of groups and individual artists in four counties. Performances and exhibitions fill the month of March to highlight the contributions and importance of women in a vast spectrum of art. This year, it will run from Sunday through March 30, and feature events ranging from concerts, art exhibits, lectures, tours and literary events.

Nagle said she thinks the opportunity to be part of a larger movement, is what has drawn so many participants.

"I think the collaboration, the cross-promotion is welcoming," she said. "I think people in this region welcome the cultural opportunities available. And I think there is an understanding that women have been an underserved population."

The Cantata singers will open the festival with a concert at 3 p.m. Sunday at the First Presbyterian Church in Horseheads. "J.S. Bach and the Ladies: Women's Influence in the Time and Music of Bach," will include work by Fanny Mendelssohn Hensel and Marianne Martinez, Nagle said. A reception celebrating the festival will follow.

The concert and festival will offer a chance not just to recognize contemporary women artists, but also t he work of women artists from the past whose work was, perhaps, hidden or underappreciated, Nagle said.

Other events range from artist exhibits - one artist, Rita Rhodes, is exhibiting at seven different venues during the month - to music, dance and readings. Among the changes this year is an expansion to three evenings of "Readings by Women Who Write," organized by the Zonta Club of Elmira and the American Association of University Women. One of those readings will take place at the Montour Falls Memorial Library and involve members of the Watkins Glen Writers' Club and the Zonta Club of Watkins Glen, marking the festival's first extension into Schuyler County.

Tioga County, NY, is also now on the festival map, thanks to festival-linked performances of "Steel Magnolias" at the Waverly Storefront Theatre.

Among the other local groups participating are the Orchestra of the Southern Finger Lakes, the Crystal Chords, Valley Folk, the Chemung Valley History Museum, the Elmira Garden Club, the Near Westside Neighborhood Association, the Chemung Valley Fiber Arts Guild and the Piecemakers Quilters Guild. Individual artists and groups will exhibit work at venues ranging from the Arnot Art Museum and the Rockwell Museum of Western Art to the Corning Community College Academic and Workforce Development Center and the Twin Tiers Racquet Club.

"It's amazing," said Martha Horton, who is helping to organize the festival. "We are thrilled with how it has all developed.

"People look for word to it now," she said. "What began as a twinkle in Will Wickham's eye three years
